Teaching and Learning in Lockdown

Thank you again for the effort that is going into your children accessing their remote learning. We understand there will be Wifi and technical glitches along the way, however we are all in this together, and are acquiring new skills and ways of making sure we can all learn in these exceptional times.

Next week we have our INSET day on Friday and school will be closed. It is a packed schedule for staff and will allow us to work on aspects of our school development plan. It is really important that we continue to look forward and dedicate time to staff training so we can support all students over the coming months and years.

We understand from parents/carers students learning at home would like a longer break in the middle of the day. To facilitate this, we will only operate full tutor times on two days a week. One day to allow for the assembly and another day for the check in with students. Heads of Year and tutors will communicate this to students separately and let them know the days for their tutor groups. On other days students have the chance to get a full break away from screens. If students would like a small group conversation, or an individual tutorial, then tutors will still be available to schedule these through Teams. Those in school will continue to operate as per the normal timetable.

We are starting to see a greater proportion of staff having to isolate with this new Covid strain, however, we are still operating the vast majority of lessons from school. We are asking those **students who are in school next week to please bring headphones into school** (we will have some sets here at school) as it is likely that for some lessons students will be bubbled into a classroom, or area with ICT access and access their Teams lessons this way. This will alleviate the need to cover a class if a teacher is unable to be in school as they are isolating. Each dedicated area will be supervised with a member of staff from the school.

Buses

The local authority has contacted us regarding the school buses. They have told Headteachers that, unfortunately It has been necessary to again withdraw a number of services across the city as usage has generally not increased. However, following the review of usage this week, the local authority has been able to reach an agreement with Brighton & Hove Buses that their 94A service will continue to run from Whitehawk via Hanover. The 94 will be combined with this so all services will run via Queen's Park Road and Elm Grove rather than Southover Street.

Book Collections

We are inviting Year 10 students to come into school next week to collect books and resources that will support learning at home. They should go to the rooms in which they are taught unless otherwise guided by their teachers. Please remind them to bring a bag to carry their book homes.
