

Weekly News Update Friday 1 April 2022

Dear Parents and Carers

As we reach the final week of the Spring term, we have seen a raft of revision sessions, drama auditions and sporting fixtures taking place in school. I was fortunate to watch the Year 10 / 11 rugby team in their match against Varndean this week, which ended with a resounding victory. The spirit, teamwork, respect and camaraderie were great to see and reminded me once again of how much we have all missed these opportunities. The skills that students gain from these sporting opportunities will stay with them for life.

I know too that many of our upper school students are excited by the prospect of the Year 10 ski trip next week, and the initial letter has already gone out to parents and carers of Year 9 students about next year's ski trip. The upcoming trip to Italy in May is now clearly in prospect, and the second of our Year 7 trips to Dolawen has been taking place this week. Preparations are continuing apace for the formal examinations, and we are looking ahead to the return of Work Experience Week for Year 10, The Duke of Edinburgh Award and of course Enrichment Week in the Summer term.

This will be the final weekly communication of the Spring term as next week we will have our end of term newsletter, The Stringer Press. Friday next week is a normal full day of teaching and school finishes at 3.10pm. We return promptly for registration at 8.40 a.m. on Monday 25 April (Week 2 on the timetable). Our hope is the warm weather will be with us by the end of April and if so, therefore, coats will no longer be worn in lessons. We will send an update about this at the start of the new term.

Changes to measures and guidance for managing Covid-19 in education settings from Friday 1 April

The Government has set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England and these include the following:

- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college, or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting

As a school we continue to follow this guidance and understand it is not possible to order the free lateral flow testing kits through the government website. We continue to ventilate rooms, stagger our entrances to the canteen to allow year groups to stay together, and will keep our one-way system. When the warmer summer weather returns, we anticipate being able to return to assemblies in person and we have the flexibility to ramp up, or ramp down our mitigations if needed over the coming term.
