

Weekly News Update Friday 25 February 2022

Dear Parents and Carers

The start of this half-term comes with optimism that we may be starting to see the tail end of the pandemic. We are now operating in a very different environment to that of 12 months ago and the time has come to return to normality as best we can whilst still exercising some caution. Clearly, should the Covid situation worsen, then we will reconsider our practices. However, following discussions here, we have decided on the following steps:

- 1. Masks are optional.
- 2. Testing also becomes optional unless symptomatic.

3. If a student or member of staff shows any symptoms related to Covid, then they should take a test and, if they get a positive result, take time out until clear.

4. Track and Trace will no longer be happening in the school.

5. The school will no longer be receiving testing kits to distribute to students.

We continue to ensure that rooms are ventilated, and we are making good use of our outside spaces at break and lunchtimes. Our staggered breaks and lunch time slots, which work well with our large cohorts, will also continue.

Well done to all the Year 11 students who have worked tirelessly in their mock examinations this week. Any students who have missed a mock should see Mrs Cumming urgently on Monday morning to see if the missed exam can be scheduled into one of the remaining exam sessions. There are just six weeks to go until the Easter break and the final countdown and push for the summer examinations.
