Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you all managed a restful and peaceful Easter break and that you are able to enjoy this coming bank holiday weekend. As we return to the summer term, we do so with hope and positivity as we renew those aspects of the education that we offer here at Stringer that have not been possible for some time. Our in-person assemblies this week followed the themes of hope and respect. It was the first time in over two years that Year groups have been fully back together, and it was wonderful to see them all in the hall. I talked to the students about taking up the opportunities that we have in school, from sport, to art and music, extra-curricular activities as well as residential trips. This half term is very short; however, as usual, we will fill it with as much teaching and as many extra-curricular activities as we can for all Year groups, and of course the GCSE exams are also on the horizon for our Year 11 students, making this a crucial half term for them.

This week we also remembered two of our former colleagues. Heather Cowl, our previous Head of Music, sadly passed away recently and a tribute to her is below. We also gathered to remember Andy Latham, our former Head of Science, who was sadly taken from us last year, as we unveiled the new sign for the renamed science area (The Andy Latham Science Block) and a bench dedicated to him with the inscription, "In memory of Mr Andy Latham, an inspirational teacher who never gave up on anyone."

Tribute to former Head of Music, Heather Cowl

At the end of last week, we received the sad news that our former colleague, Miss Heather Cowl, has passed away. Heather was a remarkable music teacher and Head of Department; she worked at Dorothy Stringer from 1975 to when she retired in 2002. Many tributes to Heather have been shared with us from former students, parents and colleagues. Charlie Linford (former head boy) summed up the thoughts of many: "Miss Cowl was the inimitable driving force behind Stringer's musical scene for decades. Her infectious enthusiasm and tireless effort to put on shows, concerts and recitals, helped share her love of music with thousands. She will be sorely missed by all."

Heather's fierce and formidable commitment to children's musical education continued after her retirement and students across the county benefited from her relentless energy and passion. Leading the school orchestra and choir for 25 years, Heather organised some remarkable gigs: from singing in the chorus of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* starring Jason Donovan at the London Palladium to performing Handel's *Messiah* in the Albert Hall; from children's choruses for operas at Glyndebourne to orchestra tours to German venues in Hamburg and beyond, Heather ensured her students made memories of a lifetime. Although her background was in classical music, she supported all musical genres and she continued to support the performing arts at Dorothy Stringer long after her retirement. In 2002 Heather was justly awarded an MBE for her admirable services to music and education. She will be fondly remembered as an inspirational teacher and a kind and generous colleague. Whilst we wish to celebrate her life and work, we shall also miss her.
