## **WiSE Project**

During this autumn half-term all Year 9 students will take part in a one-hour educational workshop addressing the topics of consent, sexual harassment and harmful sexual behaviours. These workshops will be delivered by young ambassadors from the WiSE project during their PSHE/RS lessons. We hope these sessions will help to educate and inform our students about how to identify and challenge harmful behaviours and support them to keep safe in their relationships. This intervention is part of our relationships and sex education (RSE) programme.

RSE lessons in year 2021-22 will include teaching about: healthy relationships, including friendships and intimate relationships, families, changing feelings, becoming more independent, keeping safe, consent, online media and developing self-esteem and confidence. Students will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world.

Next week is anti-bullying week. 'One Kind Word' has been chosen as the theme this year. During tutor time next week students will be discussing topics surrounding anti-bullying and working through resources with their peers. # **Canteen Price Changes - January 2022**

We have taken the difficult decision to make a small increase to some of our items on canteen menu as of Tuesday 4 January 2022. The school has not implemented a price rise in the meal deal since September 2017 but due to the continued pressure on the cost of wholesale food we cannot avoid this price increase any longer. There will be a small price increase to the cost of the main school meal. The current price is £2.30 for a main meal and a dessert. This will increase to £2.40. Prices of individual items have also been adjusted based on supplier prices; we have only increased the price of individual items where we have had no choice.

It should be noted that a school meal at Dorothy Stringer still provides excellent value for money. We will continue to offer an exciting and varied range of meals, snacks and drinks which are both healthy and nutritious. All of our menus are developed in line with the nutritional standards set by the Government's Food Policy in Schools. You can see all our menus on the <u>Canteen page</u> of our website.

For our students in receipt of Free School Meals, the increase will be applied to the daily allowance. This will ensure they continue to have access to the main meal and dessert menu.

We look forward to welcoming students back on Tuesday for the final five weeks of the autumn term.
