## Covid-19 city update

For the second consecutive week we have seen an overall reduction in confirmed cases of Covid in the Brighton & Hove.

Although the number of confirmed cases has reduced it is too early to say if this trend will be sustained. The overall fall in rates we have seen this week is due to a significant 37% dropin rates among young people in the past week.

The level of infection in older people remains a concern because of the higher risk of complications in this age group and the potential impact on health and care services.
