Safeguarding message

Like most secondary schools, we occasionally facilitate police interventions: these are conducted through focus groups, one-to-one interventions or through PSHE lessons and assemblies to promote awareness about relevant safety campaigns. These sessions are always carefully planned and monitored to support our safeguarding procedures and to ensure they are appropriate for our students. The aim is always to educate our students to make good decisions about their safety. We would always contact parents or carers before the police are allowed to speak to a student and an appropriate adult would be present.

Our students are fully aware that we have a dedicated pastoral team and of our processes for reporting any safeguarding concerns. Courses to Support Parents and Carers

The Adult Education Hub is continuing its successful online courses: 'Supporting a Young Person with Anxiety' and 'Building a Young Person's Resilience'. Both courses offer parents practical strategies to help the young person manage anxious thinking and build their self-esteem. Sessions are run separately for parents of primary and secondary-age children.
