We were fortunate this week to have Caroline Lucas, Green MP, beamed into our classrooms as part of the Speakers for Schools Green Skills campaign. Two schools took part, one from Newcastle and Dorothy Stringer, who got a special mention as a Brighton school. Over 1,000 Stringer students listened to Caroline's speech in which she talked about Climate Change and the state of the planet, the need to take positive action before 2030 and her hopes for a brighter future. She emphasised the opportunities for students considering an Eco career and her own path to becoming a Green MP. Students then took part in a question and answer session.

We are really grateful to Caroline for taking time out of her busy schedule to engage with students who one day may be the leaders of the future themselves.

This week the usual PSHE curriculum for all year groups was suspended to allow sessions on promoting safe and respectful behaviour towards others, especially focused on attitudes towards women and girls. The emphasis is on promoting understanding of the effects of prejudiced language and attitudes, challenging misogynistic beliefs and equipping students with knowledge of how to confront such behaviour. This will help our students to develop a deeper appreciation of this important subject. Some Year 10 classes will not have this session until the start of the new term because of school finishing on a Thursday next week. There will be further work throughout the year to develop this important area of the PSHE curriculum.

Home Testing

The Test Team have been issuing home testing kits to students this week. Students should take a test twice a week, as per the government guidance. We will continue to issue kits to all students next week so that they will have enough to last them over the holidays. The government guidance is to:

- test twice a week at home from now on (all those who are able to)
- report results <u>online</u> as positive, negative or void. This information is critical in helping us to understand the prevalence of the virus across the country
- continue to test twice weekly over the Easter holidays
- test before returning to school or college for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back, to find and isolate any positive cases
